St George Neighbourhood Partnership

The St George Neighbourhood Partnership aims to improve the quality of life for all residents in our part of east Bristol.

Partnership members include residents, community groups and Councillors. We work with representatives from the Police, Bristol City Council and other agencies.

Troopers Hill Local Nature Reserve

Troopers Hill, is a hillside that has been quarried and mined in the past and overlooks the River Avon. The hill contains a fascinating mix of history, wild plants and animals. With heather and broom, rocky crags and gullies, stunning views and two listed chimneys, Troopers Hill is one of the most spectacular wildlife spots in the city.

Access to Troopers Hill is from Summerhill Terrace or Troopers Hill Road.

Dundridge Park

A large green space on the edge of the Avon Valley well known as home to local football teams. This space also has a children's play area and woodland walks leading through Conham Vale to the river, from where you can follow the River Avon Trail east towards Hanham or west to Netham and the City Centre.

Access Dundridge Park from Dundridge Lane.

St George Park

A traditional Victorian Park. Get active at the wheels park or children's play area, enjoy a gentle stroll around the lake or looking at the park's wonderful trees, some dating from when the park was established in the 1880s. There is also a kiosk café where you can just sit and soak up the atmosphere.

The main entrance to the park is on Church Road at the junction with Chalks Road.
